

How to Use our Library

First of all, I urge you to visit library. It is just inside the doors to the Education Wing on the left. Frequently, you will find a member of the Library Committee who would be delighted to show you the wonderful books we have and how to take them out for your personal pleasure.

Sometimes you will find an open door and access to the collection with no one to assist you. Don't despair; I'll try to teach how you can check books out on your own. We have an honor system.

After you walk around to see how the library is organized and when you find something you would like to check out, look on the round table. On that table there is a form for your name (parents' name if you are a student) and telephone number. Please include the title and author of each book you are checking out. That's it! We'll do the rest. By the way, books are due back in two weeks. Place them in the blue box just inside the library door.

If you would like to look through our collection from the comfort of your home, just go to the Congregation Albert website www.congregationalbert.org and look for the library link. Our web page will show you how to navigate our catalog on line.
